




### AREAS OF LEARNING

- Expressive arts and design


It's really important that we allow time to support children to develop their prime areas of learning before we begin to focus on their specific areas as these are the skills they need to access the curriculum.

For example, if they do not have the physical development to hold a pencil, they will not be able to write letters or words in Literacy.





### THE ENVIRONMENT











We believe that children learn best when they feel happy and safe and we create an environment which allows that.

We plan opportunities that are practical and sensory that enhance well-being and involvement and this helps pupils access learning activities with greater confidence and perseverance. We take into account children's interests – setting up new and exciting activities on a daily basis that they want to take part in, adding to these as their interests change.



## MAKING THE MOST OF THE CLASSROOM...









Our classroom is set up to allow us to develop different skills. We always have messy play, water or sand, construction, maths, mark-making and writing, small world and craft available for children to access. This means children are exposed to a wide range of open-ended resources that encourage them to try new things, use their imagination and take control of their learning.





#### ...AND THE OUTDOORS!









We are lucky to have access to lots of outdoor space! We have free flow set up in Reception which allows the children to decide whether they want to learn inside our outside during child-initiated time.









PE for Bat Class will be on a Monday. Children will need to come into school dressed in their PE kit – black PE shorts and a white t-shirt.

#### PE will include:

- Balance bikes improve their core strength.
- Ball skills improve their co-ordination and gross motor skills.
- Parachute games improve their listening skills and following instructions








### WE VALUE YOUR SUPPORT AND INPUT

Reading books will be given out once we start Sounds Write – Phonic reading scheme.

Reading books will be **changed once a week on a Friday** and will link with the sounds we have been learning.

Reading with your child **every night** will help them to learn the sounds and read the words.
